Principal's Message

Welcome everyone to February! I believe it is the longest short month of the year. January brought us some challenging weather, including slush, rain, freezing temperatures and ice. You just didn't know what outdoor gear was needed from day to day. It will be interesting to see if February follows suit – or if it provides us with a consistent month of snow and cold temperatures.

Here at Edmison Heights, students have been engaged in a number of varied extracurricular activities during their breaks, including basketball, games club, library helpers, social justice club and soccer club – just to name a few! In schools across the board this month, there will be a focus on bullying. What is it, what it is not and how do we support our friends and ourselves to not fall victim to it. Bullying can often be insidious and difficult for adults to see. At Edmison Heights, we encourage parents to contact their children's teacher or the office if there are concerns about bullying. We can address it if we are made aware of it!

The Board will highlight our efforts to support our antibullying stance with the annual Pink Shirt Day on February 28th. The school will be reminding students to wear pink on that day to show their support for kindness and respect, in our hope to end bullying in all of our schools, in all of its forms. In our efforts to be proactive around bullying in the school, teachers will continue to initiate conversations about bullying and the ways that we can address it when we see it. We have also booked a presentation for our junior students in February by a professional wrestler on the IMPACT wrestling tour. Chris Gray will share the lessons he has learned while pursuing his passions. Chris uses the power of storytelling to teach important life principles like developing grit, the power of perseverance and being a positive role model. We are also in the process of booking a presentation with the Peterborough Pete's to discuss the impact of bullying for our older students.

We thank our parents and guardians for their continued support as we strive to make Edmison Heights PS a most warm, welcoming, and safe place for kids to learn, grow and succeed.

No parking at Edmison Heights Baptist Church

School Registration

Registration is now open for the 2024-2025 school year!

If you have a child or know of anyone that has a child who is eligible to attend either Junior or Senior Kindergarten for September 2024, please register online at www.kprschools.ca. If online registration is not an option for you, contact us at 705-745-0722 to make other arrangements.

The following information will assist you with the registration process: Junior Kindergarten students must be 4 as of December 31, 2024. Senior Kindergarten students must be 5 as of December 31, 2024. Proof of age by birth certificate or equivalent, proof of address, immunization, and Legal Custody Agreement, if applicable, must be provided. Accurate enrollment projections are key to acquiring funding from the Ministry of Education and to the Board's budget process.

Please note that if your child is attending JK already, you do not need to re-register.





Nut Aware School

Kiss and Ride & Dismissal

Kiss and Ride is open in the morning only, starting at 8:30 a.m. We thank parents for following the direction of our staff and keeping at a slow speed to keep everyone safe. All students should exit the left side only of the cars and we kindly ask that parents remain in their vehicles to speed up the process.

At the end of the day, we kindly ask parents to pick up their students in the Parent Zone in the yard at 3:15 pm and avoid parking at the front of the school. We thank you for following the arrows in the Kiss and Ride zone to travel in the accurate direction and please note that there is no parking on the right end side of the Kiss and ride zone for the safety of all staff and students.
