Budget Update – Annette Nadeau

- Our balance is currently at \$24,357.87 + a refund is coming from Lorena of approximately \$8,200 for the rock project that was completed in the summer.

New Business - Playground, Fundraising & Hot Lunch Discussions -Kim Docherty

- Kim has reached out to Henderson Recreation Equipment for a quote and drawing for a potential playground. The pictures and quotes were handed out to all in attendance. The approximate price quoted was \$106,217.74 + the costs for a board approved landscape architect. Kim says that roughly we will be looking at around \$115,000.

- Kim also gave out a draft of a letter to be sent out to all parents describing our fundraising goals this year and a breakdown of what the cost would be approximately per child. The goal is to fundraise all the money this year instead of the normal 3-5 years that a playground fundraiser takes. We haven't fundraised in 2 years and now we have something very obvious that requires attention now. Looking for approval to send out the letter with a funny little attachment "not a fundraiser" about paying cash instead of buying into fundraisers.
- We had a discussion about trying to get the playground project into action now – getting the architect, paying a deposit etc. with the funds we have now so we don't have any delays when it comes to having the playground completed possibly next summer.
- Kim also provided a couple of examples of fundraisers:
 - o "Not a Fundraiser" Fundraiser
 - Krispy Kreme Selling Price \$10-\$12 our cost \$5 to buy
 - Domino's Pizza Night Dominos would give us a promo code and a specific date where only our school would be supported for. Each purchase gives \$5 back to our school.
- Kim asked for other fundraising ideas from the group. Ideas given & briefly discussed included:
 - o Dance-A-Thon
 - Holiday Greenery Arrangements
 - Cookie Dough
 - Chocolate (Worlds Finest or Purdys)
 - Food Truck (ie. Beavertails)
 - QSP Catalog
 - o Bottle Drive January
 - Go Fund Me Account
 - Flipp Give online gift card reimbursement
 - School Class Competitions
 - Spring Carnival/Fun Fair could combine food truck too.
 - Tru-Earth
 - Adults Only Bar Night/Pub Crawl
- A vote was held and agreed upon to initiate the "Not A Fundraiser" Fundraiser, Domino's Pizza Night, Coffee & Chocolate (Christmas-ish time), Dance-a-thon & Spring Carnival/Fun Fair. Kim will follow up with dates and more information as required for these events.
- Various members were going to obtain more information on the above listed fundraising items and bring them to the table for the next meeting.

Hot Lunch Program

- Kim explained the hot lunch program. This is usually the biggest continuous fundraiser that the school holds every year. Most parents need a break from making lunches and provided a variety of hot lunches is always welcomed. Hot lunch is a volunteer heavy activity, and the past last 2 years has been hard to get consistent volunteers and schedule. Kim asked the group if there was anyone who may be able to help. Kim can help certain days until end of December but does not know what 2023 looks like at this point. Samantha said that she can help but it would need to change to maybe a Tuesday or Thursday due to her availability. Kim said that the date can change as long as there is someone available to help distribute and organize accordingly. Amy made a point saying that later in the week is usually better in her opinion for a hot lunch program.

- Discussions on what type of food we have had in the past include: Boston Pizza, East Side Mario, Kernels Popcorn, Yogen Fruz Smoothies, Pizza (usually from Pizza Shack), Pita Pit etc. A mention of Healthy Hunger was also brought up as an option.
- Pricing may go up due to current inflation. Kim would like to keep costs as low as possible to make sure all can access the hot lunches. This means that we may not make as much back in terms of a fundraiser this year.
- Kim will meet/talk to those interested and try to get the hot lunch program up and running.

Set Next Meeting Dates

- Looking at the first Monday night of every month. December has in the past (pre-covid) held at Boston Pizza. This can be discussed in the next meeting.
- Teacher rep Janet Faurschou will not be able to meet on Mondays but will discuss with Lorena about someone else taking her place potentially.
